TOWN MANAGER'S / Solution

I hope April brings some warmer weather soon, because summer is not that far away! Speaking of summer, for the first time in the four years that I've been your Town Manager, we are *fully staffed* with our seasonal team members - Lifeguards, Police Officers, Parking and Dog Ambassadors! We are ready for summertime! Our maintenance team continues to work hard getting the town ready for peak season by making new trash can bins, trimming tree branches, marking faded driveway entrances, painting the lifeguard chairs, and getting the dune mats ready for installation.

Always keeping public safety as our number one goal, DelDOT's sidewalk/driveway project has been completed in the main part of town. Sidewalks have been widened and made ADA compliant. In an effort to keep folks from jay-walking, the center island post and ropes project continues, and should be completed by April 21st. Once the center island work is completed, DelDOT will work on landscaping, flowers, and plantings in those areas. The yellow flashing crossing beacons will be lowered to ensure vehicle operators can see them. DelDOT will also be repainting the pedestrian crosswalk markings on Coastal Highway. The "Welcome to Dewey Beach" sign has been relocated to the area of Coastal Highway and Bayard Ave, closer to the town boundary. DelDOT has been made aware of some areas where water is collecting along the highway, and is considering ways to mitigate this issue. I'd like to thank everyone for their patience during this project!


The town has installed a kayak rack on the Van Dyke Bay Beach. Storing kayaks on the racks will be available starting Memorial Day to Labor Day for \$100.00. The kayak reservation form will be available on the town webpage starting in May.

We are looking forward to the Dewey Beach Partnership Egg Scoop on Van Dyke Bay Beach on the 19th. The Dewey Beach Civic League's "A History of Dewey Beach" presentation will take place from 4pm to 6pm on April 26th at the Hyatt's Sunset Room. A special thanks to the Hyatt!

The town hopes to start Phase 1 of the new Town Hall/public safety building at the end of the month. Phase 1 is estimated to take 430 days to complete. Phase 2, the EMS building, will take 170 days to complete.

climate change committee

Get to know one of Dewey's volunteer committees, and learn what they're working on to benefit *you*.

The Dewey Beach <u>Climate Change Committee</u> was created in 2022 at the suggestion of Commissioner Gary Persinger, with the goal of enhancing strategies and resilience to rising sea levels to protect our town in the face of climate change. The committee also seeks to promote public understanding of key factors such as flood zone designation and associated <u>flood risks</u>.

The group often forms smaller subcommittees to research specific challenges, recruiting the assistance of <u>RASCL</u> (Resilient and Sustainable Communities League), <u>Center for the Inland Bays</u>, and leadership of neighboring towns to share ideas and discuss where change is needed.

Over two years of work were spent on the goal of increasing the town's mandatory freeboard - a flood mitigation strategy that was first endorsed by the Climate Change Committee. With the support of the Planning Commission and the Town Council, Ordinance <u>846</u> was approved, and related Ordinances <u>849</u> and <u>850</u> soon followed.
